

My Health— CHILDREN'S VACCINATIONS

Use this checklist to make sure your child is getting the vaccinations he or she needs. Vaccinations are covered by Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance Plan (CHIP), and insurance plans purchased through the Health Insurance Marketplace.

Your doctor can give you information about how many doses your child needs of each vaccine and when these should be take place. Children who miss a dose or doses, can catch up at a later date. Some children in high-risk groups may need vaccinations on a slightly different schedule. Use this checklist to make sure you have the vaccinations you need. Vaccinations are covered by Medicaid, Medicare, and insurance plans purchased through the Health Insurance Marketplace.

Your doctor can give you information about which of these vaccinations you need, and how often you should get them. You may not need some of them if you got them as a child. If you are traveling outside the United States, you may need additional vaccines.
